S: NON-AGRICULTURAL USE

The following permit conditions apply to all Stanislaus County Restricted Materials Permits for Non-Agricultural Use

- 1. Application of restricted materials for commodity fumigation requires a Notice of Intent (NOI) at least 24 hours in advance. For weekend and early Monday applications of Restricted materials, NOIs shall be submitted by <u>3:00 pm Friday prior</u>. NOI's shall be received by 3:00 pm the business day prior to a Stanislaus County Holiday. A monthly NOI could be submitted if the fumigation takes place at the designated facility. If the application is cancelled please notify our office.
- 2. A Notice of Intent shall include the following:
 - a. Permit Number
 - b. Operator Name
 - c. Location of Areas to be treated (Site Identification Number)
 - d. Commodity Treated
 - e. Approximate Units Treated
 - f. Pesticide(s) Label Name
 - g. Rate of Application
 - h. Pest(s) to be controlled
 - i. Start Date of Intended Application
- 3. Use of Methyl Bromide and Sulfuryl Fluoride requires a valid work-site plan and the site has to be evaluated each year prior to renewal of the permit.
- 4. The Certified Applicator must be physically present on-site during the introduction of the fumigant and aeration commencement.
- 5. If the commodity remains stored within an enclosed container (bin) post fumigation, continuous monitoring for the presence of a fumigant is required when people are present.
- 6. Notice of Intent for restricted materials for non-agricultural use other than commodity fumigation is required to be submitted 24 hours prior to each application and should be site-specific.
